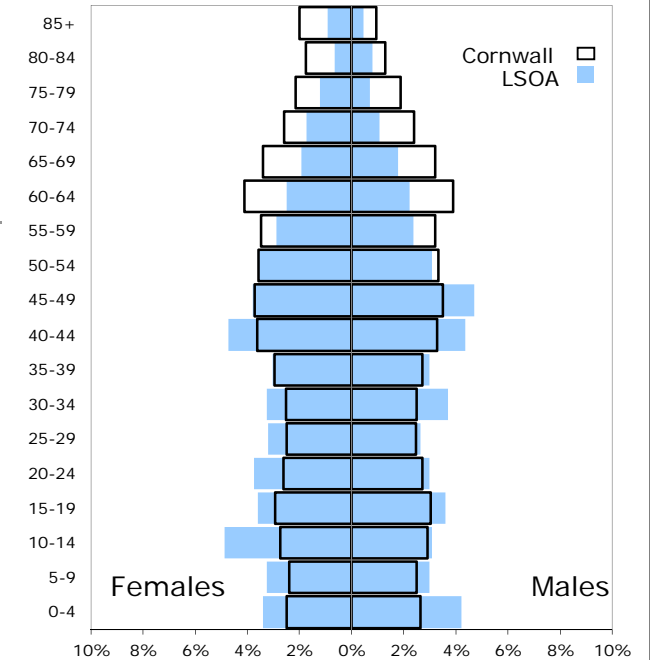

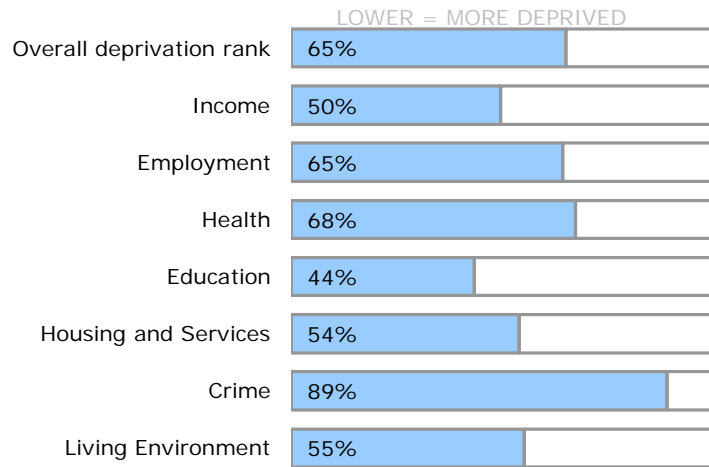
## LSOA Boundary Map

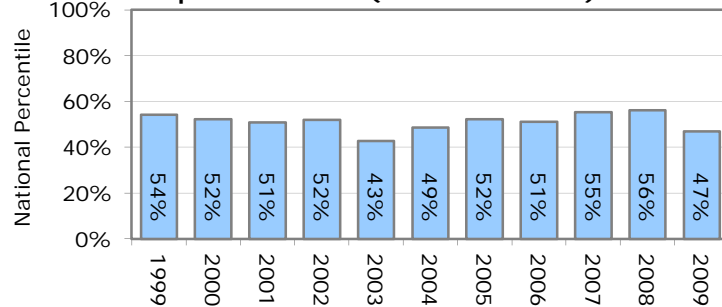
## Index of Multiple Deprivation 2010

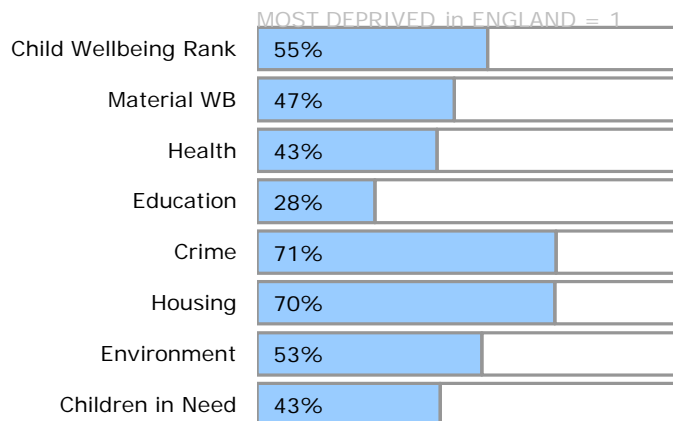

Child poverty is defined as the proportion of children living in families in receipt of out of work benefits or tax credits where their reported income is less than 60% median income.

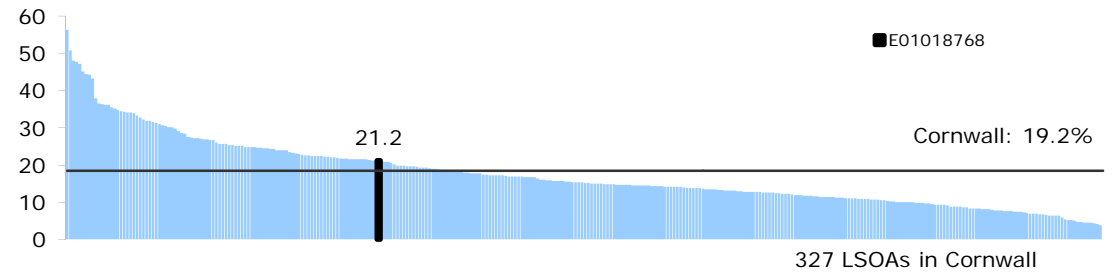

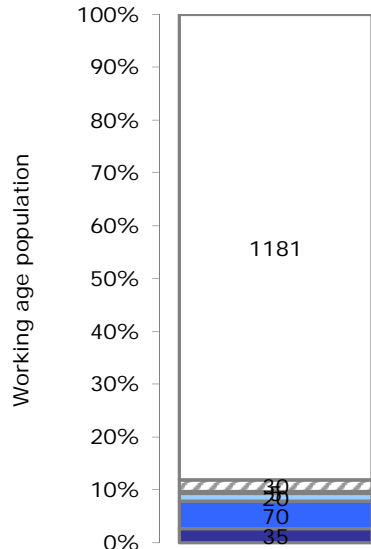
