Check Brief.

Green Space Audit Results.

Total area of green spaces.

Cornwall Counties audit had 39.99ha of green spaces. Whilst David's audit showed just 37.2ha consisting of: 6.82ha schools; 5.2 ha private paddock and closed access; 4.2ha limited access sports grounds and pitches. The largest actual public space is Castle Park.

Conclusion: Increase allocation of green spaces for new developments. POLICY: SECTION 106 MONEY TO BE BONDED.

Assessment of individual green spaces.

The assessment by topic: assess; maintenance; cultural and natural heritage. We still need to properly assess cultural and natural heritage.

Action: Contact the Duchy about Highwood.

Action: Look at Biodiversity, DEFRA map for: Highwood; Sungirt:

Tencreek and Charter Way.

To Do: civic spaces; links; informal green spaces.

Action: David to check spreadsheets and scores and upload photographs.

Evaluation

The highest scores were for: Liskerret gardens (NB mention Stuart House gardens); Westbourne gardens; Old Road nature reserve and St. Martins churchyard

Conclusions

Westbourne gardens? No - community asset. **POLICY: EXTEND LAND.** Rapsons? No 10 -has potential.

Sungirt No 14 - high potential, more paths, possible outside gym.

Pound St No 15 – Improve planting behind bench

Castle park No 17 - enhance, defined path, more benches; mobile cafe.

Castle St. No 18 – Opposite Eliot, make path up slope and move benches to top with planting.

St. Martins churchyard No 19 – more benches, plant smaller trees.

Woodland behind Morrisons No 22 – conserve, enhance, possible seating. Tencreek Woodland No 23- enhance.

Lanchard Woodland No ?- scored low but has potential for enhancement, reassess score.

Action: Create conservation group, obtain funding for tools.

Action:

No ? 38 Link Lake Lane to ? Catch French Sports fields Nos 31/32 create footpaths to link schools to existing and new housing.

Install full cut off lighting for all sports pitches.
